

**Friends of Detroit River
Detroit River AOC
Stony and Celeron Islands
Data Sharing Plan**

The Friends of Detroit River (FDR) will generate environmental data and information, including pre- restoration assessments of fish presence abundance and species, geotechnical, herpetological presents, sediment chemical characterization, bathymetry, and threatened & endangered species and habitat presence. Data will also be collected once for water temperature, dissolved oxygen, pH, and conductivity during the fish surveys.

Baseline data will be collected between November 2013 and August 2014. More specifically for each of the main activities:

- Fish: April (water quality included) 2104, May 2014, and July 2014
- Geotechnical: April 2014
- Herpetological: May 2014
- Sediment: December 2013, April 2014, and May 2104
- Bathymetry: Fall 2013
- Threatened & Endangered Species: April 2014, May 2014, July 2014, August, 2014, and September 2014

The data will be collected by the following organizations:

- Fish: Environmental Consulting & Technology, Inc. (ECT)
- Geotechnical: Somat Engineering, Inc.
- Herpetological: Herpetological Resource and Management, LLC
- Sediment: Environmental Consulting & Technology, Inc. (ECT)
- Bathymetry: Smith Group - JJR
- Threatened & Endangered Species: Environmental Consulting & Technology, Inc. (ECT) and Herpetological Resource and Management, LLC

Data will be collected according to the procedures described in the Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP). All contractors not identified in this plan will have as a condition of their contract acceptance of this data sharing plan. Data be initially collected in field notebooks and video in the case of the mussel survey for the T&E reporting. Some of the data, in the case of the fish will be transferred to electronic spreadsheets for analysis.

Data will be stored with Friends of Detroit River. Published reports will be available on the FDR website. Additionally, data will be shared through presentations on the project.
